The Surrey Early Speech and Language Program is family-centered. We recognize the critical importance of the family to the development and well being of the child. We strive to understand and meet the family's needs regarding each child's communication development.



## WHO IS ELIGIBLE

The Surrey Early Speech and Language Program provides family-oriented services for children who have communication delays or disorders.

These communication needs may include difficulty with speech sound production, vocabulary development, sentence construction, and following directions. Other areas of difficulty may include stuttering or voice problems.

We offer service for families of children from birth to school entry age who live south of 92nd Avenue, between King George Hwy and 196th Street.

## SERVICES PROVIDED

### Services for Children:

- Ongoing assessment of each child's communication needs and development.
- Individualized program for each child depending on family needs and goals.
- Community-, preschool-, home-, or clinic-based service depending on the need of the family and child.

### Services for Families:

- Parent education on speech and language development.
- Parent training of communication skills to enhance and encourage their child's speech

and language development in daily routines.

- Home-based programs that include parents, siblings, and other significant people involved with the child.

### Services for the Community:

- Consultation and training for preschool teachers, Infant Development Program consultants, Supported Child Care consultants, daycare providers, and others to provide developmentally appropriate goal-oriented service for each child's family.
- Presentations and workshops educating community service providers about specific communication challenges.
