### Language Tip of the Season:

Delve into the dark! The days are short and nights are long. Take advantage of the dark to do activities and games that require lights out and focus on your child's speech and language at the same time.

1. Shadow puppets: Take turns making shadow puppets. Play 'guess that animal'; give your puppet sound effects to practice new sounds (e.g., make your shadow snake go 'sssss')

2. Flashlight hide-and-seek: Take turns hiding and finding an object with only flashlights for help! If your child is preschool-aged, hide a boy or girl doll/figurine and practice pronouns ('I found **him/her!**'); Practice question-asking structure by chanting '**Where is the \_\_\_\_\_?**'
